"One meeting has been held with a clergyman who has agreed to help by inviting us to a local meeting of ministers," said Jim S., committee chair. "We have reached out to other clergy. It would be helpful if members of AA could provide contact info for clergy within the district, particularly clergy that currently allow AA meetings at their facilities."

Jim thanked Christine B. for providing contact information leading to three meeting with hospital personnel this month: North Bay in NPR Nov. 10, Mease Countryside Nov. 18 and Dunedin Hospital Nov. 30. In all, at least 50 hospital workers are expected to attend. District 1's PI/CPC will be involved in Pinellas County.

"We will have to load up on literature for these meetings, and we are open to any suggestions that will help us carry the message into those facilities," Jim said.

Gratitude For an AA Miracle

With three years under his belt, John L. thought it was time for a relationship.

"I did not realize just how impulsive and needy I really was at that time. I looked around the rooms and found what I thought was the perfect girl for me.

"The attraction was magnetic. Within a month we were engaged and a month later married. It was a very rocky start as she was off her medication and my rescuing was in high gear. Fifty-two days into the marriage she was admitted to a psychiatric hospital and filing for divorce. She was in love with her therapist.

"Desperate for the pain to stop, I planned a suicide by crashing my motorcycle into a bridge. It would appear to be an accident and the insurance would pay double indemnity to my children. I thought somehow that would be the amends that I needed to make before dying.

"One more AA meeting and it would be over. The meeting of course was at the psych hospital where my wife was a patient. I thought I might see her for the last time, but that wasn't to be as she didn't attend the meeting that night.

"All I heard was the last sentence of the last speaker, which saved my life. He said, 'What a shame it would be if you ended it tonight when tomorrow was the day when things started getting better.'

"I sat quietly after the meeting and thought how those words might be right. I knew in my heart that I would somehow get through this and those words gave me the courage to do it.

"There was a fellow sitting next to me after the meeting. I told him that speaker might have saved my life. His response was, 'me, too.' It turned out he had a loaded pistol on his kitchen table and was going home to end his life as well. His wife was in the same hospital and she too had filed for divorce. She was in love with another woman as well.

"We both were totally powerless over our situations, amazed at how similar our stories were, and that only God could have put us next to one another in that meeting. After talking some more we hugged and parted ways. I don't know about his final outcome, but mine was to continue recovery and find a closeness to God that I never imagined. There is no possible way that two people could have been sitting next to one another with exactly the same story without a Higher-Power's intervention.
