Step Three: Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.

I wouldn't fully concede to my innermost self that I was an alcoholic. I held on to my own ideas for a number of years after first coming into A.A. and going back out and in (you get the idea). I was the exception to the rule, unique they called it. I just wasn't as bad as you people were.

My way of thinking led me down a rough road of despair. With also several visits to jail and institutions. It wasn't until I came to a pitiful and incomprehensible demoralization in my life. I now understand what that means. I finally hit rock bottom and could really go no lower. That delusion that I was like other people was finally smashed to

smithereens.

I finally surrendered and honestly and completely admitted that I am powerless over alcohol and my life had become unmanageable.

At this point I became open-minded enough to come to believe that a Power Greater than myself could restore me to sanity.

By this time I could honestly see that I was not doing too good of a job with running my life, that maybe I'd better let someone else help me from here on out.

I had been a negative, defiant person for way to long my whole attitude and outlook toward life was bleak at best. There had to be a better way of living than the way I have been. It became my nature to be the way I've been for so long. I was no longer happy with my life. I

was ready for a change.

I was now willing to go any length to get what I see in the people of A.A.. I was completely ready to discard my old ideas for new ones. I totally believed that this Power could work in my life the way I see it work in others.

I saw others solve their problems by a simple reliance upon the Spirit of the Universe. I had to stop doubting the power of God. My ideas did not work. I saw that the God idea did. I simply had to let go absolutely and make a decision to turn my will and life over to the care of God as I understood Him.

"have a seat" - we understand.
