# "My Last Hope"

He came to

AA

For one reason only

When I came to AA, I did so voluntarily-but only because I believed it was my last hope. I did not come because of my wife and children; I had made promises to them and had failed too many times before. I did not come because an employer threatened to fire me, although I certainly deserved it. I did not come because a judge ordered me, although it could have happened. I didn't come because a psychiatrist recommended it, although he should have. I didn't even come to stop drinking, I had done that on my own several times. I came through those door for only one reason— to get the help I had to have to keep from picking up that first drink.

Soon after my typically unspectacular entrance into the Fellowship, I began to hear people saying "I am a recover<u>ing</u> alcoholic." I knew some of them had many years of sobriety. Surely, they were recover<u>ed</u>, weren't they? But I came to learn that the disease of alcoholism is incurable. I was told that I could arrest it and prevent the visible manifestation by not drinking alcohol, but the disease would continue to develop. This explained why, after each period of dryness, succeeding binges had gotten worse and my behavior got uncontrollable.

Next, I realized some members were referring to themselves as "grateful alcoholics." Of course I thought they were *really* sick. How could anyone of reasonably sound mind be grateful for an incurable disease. Then I found that they were grateful for having

found AA and its entirely new way of life, a style of living usually more gratifying than anything they had known, drunk or sober– in some cases far better than in pre-alcoholic days. And I began to reach my own "pink cloud".

As each passing twenty-four hours linked into weeks and months, I came to understand myself a little better. Life was difficult at times; I still had problems— some more trying than anything I had ever faced— but I not only survived, I grew. Maturity began to develop; memory returned. With the regaining of memory came the loss of the "I nevers." I identified more with speakers. Each time I spoke or reflected on my past, I became aware of something that had been carefully

concealed in the recesses of my mind or rationalized so well that it was hard to recognize.

It was then that I came to the basic reality: I am a "typical" alcoholic. If I had read the case histories in the Big Book and used them as a guide to achieving alcoholism, I could not have followed the trail any better. None of us did it all, but we all did it. It doesn't matter how much we drank, what we drank, where we drank, or what we did when we were drunks. The significant thing is what happened to me when I drank.

And so I have learned that, while I am recovering and grateful and typical, the important thing to remember is that I am an alcoholic.




