EVERYDAY SOBRIETY

I woke up this morning, tired. I had a cast party yesterday for a recovery play that I was a part of , and I just couldn't unwind when I got home, so somewhere around 12:30 A.M. I wrote in my journal, read a story out of my Grapevine, prayed, and went to sleep. At 7:00 A.M., when the alarm went off, I did not want to get up. Yes, I know it's my Sunday morning women's meeting, I know it's the first meeting of the month-when I normally bring in the new phone lists-but hey, I'm an old woman and I need my rest. Besides, they already have some of last month's meeting lists left over. I can just sleep in today and bring in the new lists next week. No big deal.

So I turned off the alarm, and rolled over to sleep in. Then I heard the voices of the women who were there when I came in. "We got up when we were tired so that we could be there for you, Carmen." I pulled the pillow over my head, but they just kept whispering. "We were there for you; What about you being there for someone new?" So, yes, I got up and dragged my tired butt to the meeting. Now, I'm not altruistic and I'm not a bleeding heart. I just remember that they were there, and they entrusted the program to me. Back then, I was a twenty-seven-year-old "kid" who was scared that this AA deal would not work for me, and then what would I do?

Today, I think it's my responsibility to pass this program on to the newcomers in as complete and pure a fashion as it was given to me-not compromised by my particular thought processes or quirks or even beliefs. Just the Twelve Steps, the Twelve Traditions, the Twelve Concepts, the Big Book, and the rest of the literature.

My responsibility to AA meetings means that I take a commitment and I keep it, even when I'm tired, like today, or when life unexpectedly comes up and throws me a curve. I take care of my commitment or I get help in covering it.

Finally, my responsibility to myself is taking on a new form. When I came into the program, I was the "I'll never grow up!" kid. Become an adult? I shuddered at the thought. But after spending a lot of time in the program, doing a lot of Step work, and just getting older, I've found that being an adult is okay and taking responsibility for myself is nice. I got to participate in the recovery play that I mentioned earlier. I love musical comedy and would do it every day of the week if I could, but because of my physical limitations, if I push myself too hard I'll get hurt, and that, for me, is irresponsible. So, as much as I love the plays, I'll be limited to one per year. This way, I can participate a little longer before limitation shuts me down. Seems to be more reasonable, somehow. Hmm-reasonable. Who'd have ever believed that I'd grow up, let alone reasonable? Sobriety is amazing, and I am so grateful.
